How does the program work?

In the spring of their junior year, students submit a project proposal and two letters of recommendation. Approximately 15 students are selected based on the ambitious nature of the stated project goal and detailed plans to reach that goal. Students work on their projects during the summer months.

How do I apply?

- 1. Start thinking about your project NOW!

- 3. Request two references to submit on-line recommendation forms found on the Hoover Presidential Foundation website by March 15.
- 4. Applications and recommendations must be received by March 15.
